



ABOUT DIABLO CANYON POWER PLANT



Welcome to San Luis Obispo County. We are glad you have chosen to visit. A fixture within our community is the Diablo Canyon Power Plant (DCPP). DCPP is a nuclear power plant that generates approximately 10% of California's electricity. Both PG&E and the County of San Luis Obispo have developed detailed emergency plans that would be used in the unlikely event that an emergency were to occur at DCPP.

If a serious emergency were to occur that would require you to take action, the County would sound the Early Warning System sirens. The sirens are an indication to tune to a local radio or television station for emergency information and instructions.

When at sea, tune to Marine Channel 16.

The siren system is tested regularly throughout the year and may be used for any local emergency.




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Welcome to the beautiful Central Coast and the cooling fall weather. Thank you for picking up this copy of the San Luis Obispo County Visitor's Guide!



Featuring products for the everyday gourmet

Walking into SLO Olive is like visiting a charming shop in Tuscany. Its dark wood accents, rock wall, and rows of local olive oils and Modena balsamic vinegar exude welcoming Old World vibes.

Jim Helser purchased the shop in late 2023 from the previous owner, Ray Russell. Five years after retiring from 28 years as co-owner of a cycling clothing manufacturer, Helser jumped back into the working world.

"I've always dreamed of having a gourmet boutique," Helser said. "I was a customer before becoming the owner and loved everything about this place. When Ray decided to retire, it all worked out. I have a passion for this, and just really enjoy it."

Armed with a background in marketing and online sales, Helser revamped the store's website and social media and launched newsletters filled with recipes, industry news, and product information. It didn't take long for the word to spread about new selections of local extra virgin olive oils (EVOO), Italian balsamic vinegar, and an expanded selection of kitchen and personal products.

"The customers loved Ray, and he did a great job of setting this shop up for success," Helser said. "I continue to build on what he started while adding my personal touch and introducing new products."

The shop's tagline, "SLO Olive, for the Everyday Gourmet" is featured on all of Helser's merchandise, emphasizing that one does not have to be an expert to use and appreciate specialty olive oil. His personal favorites include the Koroneiki EVOO and the Italian Blend BearBird EVOO.

BearBird EVOO. Local California EVOO and Italian balsamic vinegars

Since taking ownership, Helser has reached out to olive oil producers in North SLO County, including Paso Robles and San Miguel.

"There are so many small ranches producing amazing olive oils," he said. "There are all these wonderful products that are gold medal winners. The climate here stresses the trees and they produce a more robust fruit. That's something that everybody in the world of olive oil wants."

Everyone entering SLO Olive can expect to be greeted by Helser or one of his staff and learn more about the oils and other products they carry.

"It's really important for me to greet each visitor, pour samples for them, describe what they're getting, and where the product is from," he said. "I mean, that's the most fun part!"

"It's very different here, but the only way they know that is when I walk them through everything," he said. "I love talking about the origin of each product and letting customers know this is local, or this one is a gold medal winner. They walk away with a big appreciation of what this is all about."

Helser relies on multiple California importers for balsamic vinegar from the Modena region of Italy. His signature balsamic, the Reserve Aged, is the store's top-selling product. Helser says even if customers didn't come in for balsamic, 90% of the time they'll walk out with the Reserve Aged.

Never run out of your favorite olive oil or balsamic! Bring in those empty SLO Olive bottles to be refilled at a discounted price. Find a variety of gifts for every occasion, including sample sets, and duo and trio 250 ml. sets. Future plans include adding local meats and cheeses and a second location on the coast.

Visit San Luis Obispo's unique museums

San Luis Obispo offers some of the best and most varied museums in the area for history, art, local culture, events, and activities for all ages. Each museum provides a special view of the region's history and culture. In San Luis Obispo, there's a museum for every interest.

Check the individual museum websites for more information about visiting, events, and activities.

San Luis Obispo Museum of Art

Every experience at SLOMA delivers a unique view of the artistic and creative side of the region's lifestyle and interests. Exhibits include

all manner of artwork, paintings, sculpture, photography, fine crafts, and a permanent collection that defines the roles of artists that are important

to the local region and California. Along with the exhibits, community programs include films, concerts, art talks, and educational programs. Admission is free to the museum but there may be an admission fee for some of the events and activities.

Current and upcoming exhibits include:

- Whose Waters? Running through October 20, 2024, this exhibit explores the experiences and reflections about surfing from nine artists.
- The 2024 mural project by American artist MOMO, is scheduled to be completed in August and open for public viewing into 2025.
- Maria Molteni: Beautiful Seven, until November 6, 2024, creates a cycle of beats on the fingers and illustrates a childhood shortcut for praying the Rosary when beads have gone missing. The artist has returned to the modular, rhythmic orb-based practice of prayer, which transcends boundaries of faith and constructs of time.
- Whitney Bedford, from October 26 to February 16, 2025,



an exhibition of paintings by prolific Los Angelesbased painter Whitney Bedford, whose work depicts evocative landscapes and

seascapes, blending gestural abstraction with precise, delicate detail to explore themes of nature, memory, and emotion.

The Art Museum is located at 1010 Broad St, San Luis Obispo, and is open from 11 a.m.-5 p.m. Thu-Mony, open for school and group tours only Tue-Wed. Closed on major holidays. Admission is free. History Center of San Luis Obispo County

The History Center of San Luis Obispo County has been a favorite place for historians for more than 60 years. A vast collection of correspondence, newspapers, directories, maps, and photographs are resources for historical and genealogical research in San Luis Obispo County. The exhibits are opportunities to explore the history of the area as it leads to today's lifestyles and cultures.

Central Coast Veterans Memorial Museum

The Veteran's Museum honors all veterans of all generations, with emphasis on those from the Central Coast. The collections and displays include military artifacts from WWI to today, historical memorabilia, and a research library. The Central Coast Veterans Memorial Museum is the only Central Coast site certified by the Library of Congress for recording interviews for the Veterans History Project.

The San Luis Obispo Children's Museum

The San Luis Obispo Children's Museum was created to provide a fun place for children and families

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to explore, discover, and learn through hands-on exhibits and programs. San Luis Obispo Railroad Museum

The San Luis Obispo Railroad Museum has it all, from the first narrow-gauge Pacific Coast Railway that carried people and goods from Avila to San Luis Obispo, through the arrival of the Southern Pacific Railroad in 1896, to modern times. The exhibits include a variety of railroad cars and railroad equipment, includ-



ing a 1926 Pullman observation car. The museum presents a variety of displays and artifacts that cover railroads and railroad topics such as Surf, Santa Maria Valley, Southern Pacific, Amtrak, Port San Luis, the Pacific Coast Railway, Orchard Express, Union Pacific, and more. A variety of community events are hosted throughout the year.

The museum, located at 1940 Santa Barbara Avenue, is open every Saturday from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Admission is \$5 for adults and \$3 for children, members and kids under 3 are free. Your experience starts with an uber-friendly staff in the clubhouse which includes Dairy Creek's well-





The San Luis Obispo Creek empties into the bay at Avila Beach providing views of native wildlife along with the region's unique marine life. Piers in Avila Beach

Avila Beach boasts three piers, two historic piers and a private pier that houses the California Polytechnic State University's Center for Marine Sciences. The Harford Pier, built in 1873, was used for shipping before the railroad arrived. The pier also has a romantic history as a liquor smuggling hotspot during the 1920s. Today, the pier is occupied by commercial fishing and restaurants and is open to pier-fishing. Avila Beach Pier was built in 1908 and was important for fishing and ocean-bound passenger transportation. It

has been partially closed to foot traffic since 2015 due to storm damage. For information about the piers, call (805) 595-5400.

The Bob Jones Trail starts at the trailhead on Ontario Road and wanders along the San Luis Obispo Creek. The paved trail, about three miles from trailhead to downtown Avila Beach, is a mostly smooth hike or bike ride with benches along the way.

Enjoy views of the historic Pismo Beach Pier and take advantage of a variety of water sports like kayaking and surfing. Green spaces with trails and panoramic ocean views include Dinosaur Caves Park, Chumash Park featuring coastal wetlands, Margo Dodd Park, and the Pismo Preserve. Millions of Monarch butterflies migrate to the Monarch Butterfly Grove in the cool months.

Pismo Beach and its companion communities provide lodging for every budget. Enjoy the iconic wholesome food and fine wines that are hallmarks for San Luis Obispo County. Gifts, original art, clothes, jewelry and décor can all be found tucked away in the many galleries and shops. A day or more exploring Pismo Beach gives a lifetime of memories.

Attractions

Dinosaur Caves Park

Located at the corner of Cliff Street and Shell Beach Road, this 11-acre park is popular with walkers, photographers, dog lovers, joggers and fishing enthusiasts. Observe dolphins, whales, sea otters and other sea life as well as sea and shore birds such as gulls, cormorants, and Peregrine falcons. Reservations may be required for group events. Oceano Dunes

Thousands flock to the Oceano Dunes State Recreational Park to camp along the ocean in tents and RVs every week. You can rent and ride dune buggies and ATVs on the beach and enjoy riding for the entire afternoon. There is a small cost per vehicle to drive on the beach and it is recommended you have a larger vehicle before attempting to drive on the dry sand; you don't want to get stuck in the dunes.

Ocean views

Pismo Beach is home to several parks with beautiful, panoramic views of the Pacific Ocean and birds and marine life that live and migrate through the Central Coast. A few of the most popular parks with exquisite views, trails, places to rest, picnic and enjoy the scenery include:

· Chumash Park covers 38-acres of

wetlands, willows, oaks and is home to a rich variety of birds and wildlife. Bring a camera. Leashed dogs are welcome.

- Eldwayen Ocean Park meanders over a mile along the bluffs and has stairs down to the beach and the tidepools. Check a tide chart to visit during low tide to explore the tidepools.
- Margo Dodd Park, located on a bluff above the ocean includes breathtaking panoramas of the ocean, beaches and surrounding areas. Bring binoculars and a camera. Walk the sandy beach to a tidepool at the end of Pier Street.

Hiking and scenic walks at the Pismo Preserve

The preserve provides over 11 miles of trails wandering through 880-acres of oak woodlands and coastal ridges and some of the most stunning panoramic views of the Pacific Ocean and surrounding land and beaches. Trails are marked for the direction of travel. Park is open weekdays from sunup to sunset.

Price Historical Park

This four-acre park and open space provides hiking trails and a class 1 bike trail. The park incorporates a self-guided history

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Central Coast has the most monarch butterflies in the state

The annual winter population is 177,570 in Central Coast, 233,394 in the state

The Central Coast is favored by the Western monarch butterfly, with 76% of the state's population in San Luis Obispo and Santa Barbara counties. The best places to visit the monarchs in San Luis Obispo County are at the Pismo State Beach Monarch Grove, with 16,038 butterflies reported, and the grove at Morro Bay State Park, with over 10,000 butterflies.



The Melodrama provides a unique live theatre experience in which costumed actors usher guests to their seats, take orders at the snack bar, and serve grub in addition to performing. Some fans have called it a cross between a Saturday Night Live and Disneyland. And every show is followed by a vaudeville revue packed with song, dance, and comedy, so you get two shows for the price of one!

The Western monarch migrates from overwintering sites along California's coast inland, all the way into Canada and back to the coast every year. The populations at the various California overwintering sites are counted every year in November and December by the Xerces Society for Invertebrate Conservation.

The Pismo State Beach Monarch Grove is one of California's principal overwintering sites for the monarch. The butterflies can be seen hanging in clusters on the eucalyptus trees in the grove and now and then, a few will flutter around, adding a sense of a magical wonderland to the grove.

The Pismo State Beach Monarch Grove is also the trailhead for the Western Monarch Trail. Officially launched on Earth Day in April 2022 when the first interpretive panels were installed in the park, the Western Monarch Trail follows the migration route of the monarch butterfly through California and other western states.

The panels at the Pismo Beach monarch grove, in Spanish and English, provide information about the monarch butterflies and what we can do to help preserve and restore the population. Experts in the field and representatives of participating organizations have all collaborated to create beautiful and informative panels.

The declining monarch butterfly population has been a concern for scientists and butterfly enthusiasts since 2014 when a dramatic decline was observed in Eastern monarch butterflies hibernating in Mexico. Scientists attribute the decline to the disappearance of the monarch milkweed plant, the only plant the monarch caterpillar will eat. Statewide 1995 butterflies were counted in January 2020, a chilling drop from the millions of Monarchs that used to overwinter at various California sites.

Monarch butterflies leave their overwintering sites in the spring to breed and migrate north as far as Canada. They breed and hatch several generations on their way north, each generation living only a short time except for the last generation, which returns to their overwintering groves. The Western Monarch overwinters along the California Coast. The Monarch butterflies that overwinter in Mexico migrate through the eastern United States, then return to Mexico.

The best spots to see and learn more about the Monarch butterfly on the Central Coast are the Pismo Beach Butterfly Grove and the grove at Morro Bay State Park.

Visitors to the grove at Pismo State Beach, located just off State Highway 1, are greeted by knowledgeable and well-informed volunteer docents offering talks and information about the butterflies visiting the grove.

The Pismo State Beach Monarch Grove is located at 400 S Dolliver St, Pismo Beach. For more information visit parks.ca.gov.

Pismo Fish and Chips—serving families since the 1960s

Original customers are now bringing their grandkids

Any trip to the beach is incomplete without a bowl of clam chowder or a plate of fresh fish and chips. It seems like restaurants are opening and closing at an alarming pace, but Pismo Fish and Chips has been an institution in Pismo Beach since the early 1960s. It started when the Zechner family immigrated to America from Holland in 1959. They did odd jobs around town and even received help from a local church. With \$500 Ann Zechner opened a fresh fish market across

from where the restaurant still sits. She had no experience running a fish market, but that didn't matter. It was a success!

Her husband, Zack Zechner, who was helping in the market, found a wallet nearby with \$900 inside (for context the minimum wage was \$1.00 per hour in 1962). He immediately called the man who had lost his wallet. Of course, the man was grateful and offered a large reward, but Zack refused. The man turned out to be the local bank president, and he told Zack to call if he ever needed help.

Well, the Zechner's did need help. They wanted to open a restaurant, but couldn't raise the money they needed. They tried everything with no success until Zack contacted the bank president who gave them





the loan even though they didn't qualify for it. Zack's good deed paid off because they opened Pismo Fish and Chips in 1963 with that loan, and the rest is history.

Little has changed inside the restaurant since 1963. The mural of Holland is still on the wall, and diners sit in cozy booths. Many of the employees have been there for decades, and the recipes that people lined up for in the 1960s are the same recipes that are served today.

The restaurant stayed in the family until 2014 when Karishma and Arpan Smith bought it. The Smiths appreciate the rich history of the restaurant and are dedicated to keeping it the same as it's always been. Karishma Smith said, "Every day we hear stories from our customers about how they have been coming here since the 60s or 70s and now they bring in their grandkids. It has become a family tradition to come here every time they are in Pismo and they have so many memories built in this place over the years."

The Smiths keep the menu current with their new specials, but the traditional menu relies on the reci-



pes from the 1960s. Karishma states, "We are known for our Wild Caught Alaskan Cod Fish and Chips. Each order is hand cut and hand dipped in our signature tempura style batter and made fresh per order." Of course, the menu has more than just fish and chips. Diners can have

a bowl of chowder, a hamburger, a salad, grilled fish, or even crab legs and lobster. They have a little bit of everything!

Stop by and taste a little bit of Pismo Beach history on your next trip!


Lopez Lake Recreation Area

Much to do in the Village

Roosters, history, museums, pizza, wine, beer, festivals, and more are all waiting in Arroyo Grande, known as the Village to locals.

Arroyo Grande is one of those towns offering old-time ambiance and modern-day amenities. This charming village is filled with one-of-a-kind shops with antique and vintage items, collectibles, clothing, sporting goods, gifts, and more.

Pizza, a swinging bridge, history, and roosters

Hungry after shopping? Stop in for a little piece of Alaska at Klondike Pizza. Specialty pizzas are on the menu and locals say the place is haunted.

Be sure to take a walk over the Swinging Bridge, the only one of its kind in California. The bridge is 171 feet long and swings 40 feet above the stream. The bridge was donated to the city in 1911.

Visit historic buildings dating from the late 1800s and early 1900s in Heritage Park. Concerts in the park offer live bands, dance troupes, and other performances.

Centennial Park hosts the weekly Farmer's Market and is home to a troupe of free-ranging roosters. The Arroyo Grande Village Roosters have become quite famous. They even have their own Facebook page where fans can keep up with them and the flock of chickens.

Concerts and festivals

Arroyo Grande hosts festivals for just about every occasion and season. From celebrating holidays, and the new year, to spring, summer, and fall harvest, Arroyo Grande is the place for families to enjoy outdoor music, vendors, and lots of tasty food, beer, and wine.

- Free summer concerts are held at the Rotary Bandstand in Heritage Square Park every Sunday through September 22 from 1-3 p.m. Bring picnic baskets, lawn chairs, and blankets to enjoy a variety of musical themes.
- The Harvest Festiva, a tribute to agriculture, held the last weekend in September, includes a parade, toe-tapping entertainment, agricultural exhibits, and lots of food, games, and arts and crafts booths.

Parks and open spaces

Along with one of the few offleash dog parks within miles, enjoy some unique open spaces:

- Fire Resistive Landscaping Demonstration Garden: This garden located at the corner of Traffic and Station Way demonstrates wildfire-resistant areas that are also beautiful gardens that enhance the environment.
- Health Fitness Park at 834 Fair Oaks Avenue, has jogging trails, exercise stations, and a heart check station.
- The James Way Oak Habitat, located on James Way is a 73-acre oak preserve with equestrian, walking, and jogging trails winding through majestic oaks. Birds of prey, deer, and other wildlife are found in this area. The area is open from 7 a.m. to sunset.

Nipomo is a small town on the mesa in the southern area of San Luis Obispo County that is known for its stands of eucalyptus trees, expansive golf courses and special outdoor and nature experiences.

Nipomo preserves a spirit of true frontier land even while modern businesses thrive in its commercial areas. Standing on the wet sand of the shore of the Pacific, looking out over the sprawling Guadalupe-Nipomo Dunes toward the rich, riparian woods, creeks, fresh water lakes and the Santa Maria River, one imagines seeing the same views that the original Chumash saw while going about their daily activities. The word "nipomo" means "base of the hills" in the Chumash language.

Bostonian sea captain, Captain William G. Dana acquired a land grant in 1837, and settled the 37,888-acre Rancho Nipomo. His adobe house still stands near the 101 Freeway.

Attractions

Guadalupe-Nipomo Dunes

The 3,400-acre Guadalupe-Nipomo Dunes Preserve is one of the largest remaining coastal dune systems in the nation and is a mustsee excursion for hikers, naturalists and bird-watchers. Catch glimpses of more than 200 varieties of birds and view more than 120 imperiled plants and animals within the preserve's National Wildlife Refuge and surrounding dune habitat.

Nipomo Native Gardens

A forest of native plants and trees are maintained by volunteers from the Nipomo Native Gardens Society. The Nipomo Native Garden is a 12-acre site located between Pomeroy, Camino Caballo and Osage, nipomonativegarden.org.

Nipomo Swap Meet

The huge Nipomo Swap Meet and Flea market is on the grounds adjacent to the 101 Freeway at the Teft Street off-ramp. The Nipomo Swap Meet & Flea market combines great family entertainment with old school swap meet atmosphere. It is the largest swap meet on California's Central Coast and is open Sat - Sun 6 a.m. - 6 p.m. \$3 parking on Sun. No dogs. Visit nipomoswapmeets.com or call (805) 929-7000 for more information.

Dana Adobe Historical Landmark and Cultural Center



The park is well-used with daily visitors throughout the year who go there to hike, picnic, fish, camp, surf, take a dip in the ocean or visit the tide pools. Elfin Forest

The forest has nearly 200 species of plants, more than 100 varieties of birds, and many species of mammals and reptiles and amphibians. The forest includes a 1-mile boardwalk that is wheelchair accessible at the north end of 16th Street. Guided tours are given on the third Saturday of each month at 9:30 am starting at the north end of 15th Street off Santa Ysabel. (805) 528-0392.

Baywood Pier

The pier, at the intersection of 2nd Street and El Morro Ave., overlooks the shores of the back bay of Morro Bay. The Los Osos Oaks State Reserve Half-mile east of South Bay Boulevard on the south side of Los Osos Valley Road. The reserve has an easy one-mile trail through the "Pygmy Oaks", which are dwarfed coast live oaks. The low canopy reserve is on the site where Chumash once lived.

Los Osos Community Park

Located at the corner of Los Osos Valley Road and Palisades Avenue, the park includes a 17,000-square-foot skate park, three tennis courts, playgrounds and restrooms. The park is ideal for walking or picnicking and is the site of the Los Osos Valley School, one of five original one-room schoolhouses between San Luis Obispo and the coast. Of those five, only two still exist today, both in Los Osos.

Sweet Springs Nature Preserve

Located on the north end of Ramona Avenue between Broderon and 4th Street, the park is open from dawn to dusk and has trails that wander through the Monterey cypress and eucalyptus trees around two freshwater ponds and a salt marsh to the edge of Morro Bay.

Baywood Park Farmers' Market

On Santa Maria Avenue between 2nd and 3rd streets. The market takes place every Monday from 2-4:30 p.m. (805) 748-1109.

Bear statues

On your way into Los Osos notice the large grizzlies stationed as guards into the town at South Bay Boulevard and Los Osos Valley Road. The statues were created by local artist Paula Zima.



Explore the natural beauty of Morro Bay, a town famous for its fog and fishing. Whether for a day or a week, this small town by the Rock has something for everyone.

Morro Bay is bursting with exciting activities to try. There's deep sea fishing, whale watching, world-class surfing, hiking, biking, and kayaking.

When it comes to birdwatching, there's little doubt that Morro Bay provides the best chance for observing a great variety of species. It's an incredible birding spectacle. There are also harbor seals, sea lions, and sea ofters.

Looking to take a slower pace? Stroll down the Embarcadero and browse gift shops and art galleries. Explore the local cuisine and dine on fresh caught fish. Sit on a bench in Tidelands Park and watch the boats leaving the harbor or take a walk on the beach and watch the waves. Walk out the harbor boardwalk to Morro Rock, the 576-foot volcanic plug that looms over the bay and seashore. Keep an eye out for sea otters that rest in the kelp beds near the shore.

Attractions

Morro Bay Maritime Museum

This museum has been preserving and interpreting the maritime history, especially that of California since 1995. The current fleet on exhibit includes the tug boat "Alma" that rescued sailors from the December 1941 Japanese attack on a Union Oil tanker off the coast of Morro Bay and the "Avalon," one of two Deep Submergence Rescue Vehicles (DSRV) submarines designed to rescue crews of downed submarines. The museum is located at 1210 Embarcadero in Morro Bay. For hours visit morrobaymaritime.org.

Morro Bay State Park

Morro Bay State Park, located at 60 State Park Rd. Morro Bay, features lagoon and bay habitat, all in view of Morro Rock. The park has opportunities for sailing, fishing, hiking and bird watching and features a marina and an 18-hole golf course. The Morro Bay Golf Course is located at 201 State Park Rd. North Point Natural Area

Operated by the City of Morro Bay, the North Point Natural Area has a stairway that leads down to the beach. Once on the beach, people can walk north to Cayucos or south to Morro Rock. The beach has one of the best tidepool areas. In the spring, the meadow is full of blooming wildflowers. The entry is located on Toro Lane in Morro Bay.

Black Hill Trail

Located at Main St and Parkview Dr., this 2.5 mile trail is a moderate hike. The trail is a favorite spot for nature walks and birdwatching. Leashed dogs are welcome.

Giant chessboard at Centennial Parkway

According to the United States Chess Federation, the Giant Chessboard at Centennial Parkway, 806 Embarcadero, is only one of two outdoor chessboards in the United States. The other is located in New York City. The Morro Bay Chess Club installed chess tables and benches adjacent to the Giant Chessboard. The Giant Chessboard is available for reservations, Monday through Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., through the Morro Bay Recreation Services for a small fee. 

With the original store already a long-time Cambria tradition, the second location opening in Morro Bay in April is the culmination of owner JoAnna Crebs' collecting and curating efforts.

"I've spent my time working on attracting the best talent, and this store has been the fruition of that," aaid Joanna. She has taken her time finding the best antique dealers for the store. Like her and her husband Myles, many of the dealers are enjoying this as a second career. They're professionals who take pride in what they find and sell. She adds, "These folks are not junkin' around. They work on getting a really good product. At this store, we only allow antiques and vintage. You're allowed to have just a little bit of new for décor. This is a true antique store."

So, what's the difference between the thrift stores that have been popping up everywhere and an antique store like Rich Man Poor

Man? Antiques are over 100 years old. Vintage is 20 years old or older. I bought a lot of things, and I was hooked." She then explained that this was during the 1970s, "nothing was really pretty then." She fell in love with the beauty of the vintage and antique pieces. She stopped

She and her husband were corporate accountants, a far cry from antique dealers, but they always preferred the old to the new. Their accounting jobs took them to Stone Mountain, Georgia, and while there, they opened an antique store. They worked as accountants during the week and ran the store on weekends. Sourcing antiques in Georgia was fun said Joanna because Southerners were like, "Oh this old thing." 
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as well as a huge selection of succulents, air plants and miniature garden accessories







Hearst Castle—The Enchanted Hill

'A museum like no other'

Hearst Castle, one of California's world-famous landmarks, is not to be missed when visiting the Central Coast. The castle offers at least nine tours, not counting privately arranged tours. Some of the most popular tours are wheelchair-accessible and accommodate visitors (with their support dogs) who have standing and mobility difficulties.


Hearst started building the fabulous estate on family ranchland overlooking the village of San Simeon in 1919. He called the estate "La Cuesta Encantada" - Spanish for The Enchanted Hill. By 1947, the hilltop complex included the iconic twin-towered main building, three guesthouses frequently occupied by Hollywood's famous, and 127 acres of terraced gardens, fountains, and pools.

Hearst's mother Phoebe Hearst is often credited with the inspiration for the castle by taking him on a grand tour of Europe and exposing him to castles, museums, and various cultural centers. This 1873 trip would prove to be a pivotal inspiration for William's later endeavor to construct Hearst Castle.

Phoebe Hearst was an accomplished woman in her own right, founding the University of California Museum of Anthropology, among other major contributions. With Phoebe's influence in his life, it's no wonder Hearst was drawn to hire Julia Morgan to build his castle on the enchanted hill. Hearst met Morgan through his mother, who had commissioned her as the architect of a palatial residence in Pleasanton, California.

Morgan designed the castle on the hill, the Hearst San Simeon property, and other family properties. As one of America's preeminent architects, Morgan's designs graced private homes, college campuses, women's clubs, and religious buildings.

Regular visitors to the castle included a long list of Hollywood

greats, political leaders such as Winston Churchill and Calvin Coolidge, and other notables such as Howard Hughes, George Bernard Shaw, Hedda Hopper, and Louella Parsons, well-known gossip columnists of their time

The castle was donated to the State of California in 1957 and managed by the California State Parks System. The doors first opened to the public in 1958. The castle sees over 850,000 visitors from all over the world every year.


So many tours, so little time

The guided tours include year-round and seasonal tours. The year-round tours include the private rooms and suites, the guest cottages, the kitchen, and the Julia Morgan Tour. Seasonal tours, only available at certain times of the year, include The Art of San Simeon, Hearst, and Hollywood Tour, an evening tour, and a holiday tour. Private tours for schools and other groups are also available by prior arrangement.

The seasonal two-hour Julia Morgan tour gives visitors an in-depth look at Morgan's life and career and tours of rarely seen areas of Hearst Castle. Hearst hired Morgan as the castle's architect after the death of his mother. Hearst reportedly hired Morgan to create "something a little more comfortable up on the hill." The tour highlights Morgan's gift for design and includes photographic displays of architectural drawings, family photos, and personal items.

Daytime tours include a viewing of the film "Hearst Castle – Building the Dream" in the Hearst Castle Theater at the visitor center. The film is not included in the evening tours but visitors who wish to see it can do so for a discounted cost.

Hearst Castle is located on Highway 1 above the village of San Simeon, a four-hour drive from either Los Angeles or San Francisco. Reservations are strongly encouraged. For directions, reservations, ticket prices, and information about the tours visit hearstcastle.org or call (800) 444-4445.








The city of Atascadero, originally founded by E.G. Lewis in the early 1900s as a utopian community, is a popular location for shopping, dining and strolls along the lake shore. Home to the Charles Paddock Zoo, the town has a large selection of restaurants offering a range of cuisine from rib-sticking American style to Asian, Mediterranean and more. Breweries, wine tasting, bakeries, antique stores, specialty shops, boutiques and art galleries are tucked away in locations along the main El Camino Real and on side streets around the Sunken Gardens. Popular area wineries are only a short drive from downtown and any of the town's several hotels.

Attractions

Atascadero Lake Park

A 1.3-mile easy walk path circles the lake in the park providing views of the lake, the many varieties of birds that frequent the lake and other visiting wildlife. Bring binoculars; more than 48 species of birds have been sighted at the lake and recorded on ebirds.org. Leashed dogs are allowed and the path is also a favorite place for cyclists. The park has restrooms, small barbecue and recreation areas. The Faces of Freedom Veterans Memorial occupies the edge of the park facing Morro Road and is well worth a visit. The

park is located at 9305 Pismo Ave, Atascadero just off of Morro Road (Highway 41).

Charles Paddock Zoo

The zoo is one of only 211 zoos accredited by the American Zoo and Aquarium Association, this zoo was founded in 1955 by Charles Paddock, a county park ranger who nursed injured wild animals back to health. Today, the zoo covers more than five acres. Many of the zoo residents are part of a world-wide program to preserve animals and their habitats. Some of these rare and endangered animals include the American Alligator and endangered owls and the Greater Roadrunner native to California. The zoo is located at 9100 Morro Rd, Atascadero. Historic City Hall

Atascadero's historic city hall is probably the city's best known

historic building. Located at 6500 Palma Ave. and gracing the back of the Sunken Gardens, the doubledomed Italian Renaissance building was originally constructed in 1914 as the Atascadero Administration Building. After founder E.G. Lewis declared bankruptcy the building was purchased in 1927 and, over the years, served as three different private schools and a bank. It became the Veterans Memorial Building when acquired by the County of San Luis Obispo in 1954, and served as a community building. When the City of Atascadero incorporated in 1979, government offices occupied the building until it suffered major damage in the 2003 San Simeon Earthquake. After years of reconstruction and restoration, Historic City Hall opened again in 2013.



"When the opportunity to open my shop came up, everything seemed to come together so perfectly that it was impossible to ignore," she said. "There were signs





Santa Margarita is a taste of the old west. This settlement, easily reached from Highway 101 or Highway 58 is the gateway to Santa Margarita Lake and the Carrizo Plain National Monument. The small town quickly changes from the first impression of a sleepy western town to reveal surprising shops full of antiques, quirky garden art, plants, garden supplies, creative décor, restaurants serving up wholesome meals, and winery tasting rooms. The long history of Santa Margarita, from the ancestors of today's Chumash and Salinas people through the Spanish and Mexican land grants and early American settlers until today, is being researched and preserved by the Santa Margarita Historical Society.

Santa Margarita Lake

Follow Highway 58 to Santa Margarita Park to find the lake located in Santa Margarita Regional Park at 4695 A Santa Margarita Lake Road. Be sure to head out with a full tank of gas. empleton is the epitome of small town charm. Originally founded in 1886 as the last station on the southbound Southern Pacific Railroad, the town hosted horse drawn stagecoaches that met the trains and gave passengers a ride to San Luis Obispo to connect with the next stagecoach to their destinations. Even after the railroad extended the rails south to Santa Margarita in 1889, Templeton remained the shipping point for local crops and products bound eastward and to boats in shipping ports on the coast. Grain, wood, charcoal, fruit and cattle, driven from as far away as Kern County, arrived in Templeton for the next destination.

Many of the buildings from the late 1800s are still lining Main Street and housing unique shops, wineries and restaurants serving everything from hearty country breakfasts to dinner for every taste and the Templeton Historical Museum Society.

Elevate your dining experience at La Cosecha Bar and Restaurant

Share Spanishinspired cuisine, craft cocktails, and local wines in family-style dining

The elegance of downtown Paso Robles, shared dining experiences with savory Spanish-inspired dishes, and local wines, beers, and craft cocktails all combine harmoniously at La Cosecha Bar & Restaurant. Situated directly across the street from Downtown City Park, this newly revamped eatery is a must-stop destination for visitors and locals alike.

Owners Matt and Eric Carfagnini acquired La Cosecha in the spring of 2023, and have taken the menu, hospitality factor, and approach to dining up several notches. With a mindset of exceeding the expectations of every person who steps through the doors, the Carfagnini brothers and their team have quickly become known for their welcoming ways.

"Although the roots of the restaurant are the same, the quality of the food and our overall approach to everything, from the service to the food to the cocktail program, has been significantly elevated," Matt said.

A passion for hospitality

The brothers have always had a passion for food, a family trait that stems back to their grandfather, Leonard "Lenny" Levin, who owned a Jewish delicatessen in Buffalo, New York. They also have an Italian family heritage, which is all about big family gatherings, backyard gardens, sumptuous shared dishes, and countless hours of table talk. Matt and Eric both tended bar while putting themselves through the University of Arizona, know the ins and outs of the hospitality industry, and have decades of experience running food and beverage programs across the country.

"We have been engaged in the hospitality industry for at least two decades in one manner or another, so there was always that passion for us to start a restaurant," Eric said.

When the opportunity to purchase a restaurant in a region they had grown to know and love was presented to them, everything aligned perfectly in place.

"Our parents are in Paso, and we absolutely love it here," Matt said.

Historical building, cozy and inviting décor

Situated in a cozy 100-year-old building that once housed a soda fountain, the eatery has wood accents, a bar fashioned from the fence of a ranch once owned by Alex Trebek, and a retractable wall inset that opens to a small patio overlooking the Downtown City Park. Inspired by their mom, a glass artist, the brothers feature the work of local artists on the brick façade across one wall on a rotating basis.

"The history of the building, the beautiful bricks, the lighting – all of this combines to make a great backdrop and second studio of sorts for local artists," Eric said.

Small plates, seasonal offerings, and weekly specials

Of course, with a namesake meaning "harvest" in Spanish, there's so much more to La Cosecha than meets the eye. Executive chef consultant Justin Hall and head chef Brad Spence, each armed with extensive resumes from fine dining establishments, have put together menus that guarantee customers keep coming back for more.

"Justin's way of cooking is very much a farm-to-table, and Brad embodies that concept as well," Matt said. "They have really ramped up our menus and, together, they make sure all those systems and processes are there so every guest we see is happy, has the same experience, and is excited to come back."



Some of the most requested items at La Cosecha are the shared plates or platos piqueos. One of the most popular is the pulpo or grilled octopus. Eric's favorite, the grilled lamb chops, are topped with Calabrian chile honey butter, goat cheese yogurt, and Marcona almond crumbles.

"We think this is the best way to enjoy a meal, because the more people you have, the more opportunities there are to try different dishes," Matt said. "Sharing small plates creates a cozy, casual, comfy, fun atmosphere with good energy."

A selection of unique flatbreads and fresh salads are available on both the lunch and dinner menus. Their famous Cubano sandwich and Cosecha Burger are favorites among the lunch crowd.

The dinner selections include fresh, local scallops with a carrot and saffron puree, broccolini, and a warm chorizo vinaigrette. Matt's favorite, the Mojo Chicken, is a bone-in and roasted half section, topped with



charred scallion vinaigrette and served alongside a congri (rice and beans) Cubano.

In addition to the standard menu offerings, there are weekly specials utilizing fresh in-season products. Known for serving up some of the best paella around, La Cosecha offers three different options – chicken, seafood, and a mix of both – of this best-seller.

Local wine, beer, and craft cocktails

"This restaurant, even before we took over, has strong, long-standing relationships with many of the core wineries and breweries in the area," Eric said. "And, when it comes to craft cocktails – from the ingredients, to how we're producing syrups, to how we're actually building the drinks from the ground up, we are second to none."

Along with the food menus, the team at La Cosecha makes a few seasonal changes to the offerings cocktail offerings, featuring available products, whether herbs, fruits, or vegetables.

"We like to keep things interesting," Eric said. "When you come back for the second or third time to have a meal with us, you're likely to see an entirely different menu, cocktailwise and maybe food-wise, too, depending on the season. It's fun, adventurous, and keeps people engaged."





Sangria hour and coffee after dark



Coffee After Dark, offered from 8:30 p.m. until close, carries the trend of espresso martinis paired with a selection of house desserts.

"What we're delivering in both of these periods is not only extremely special but also of extreme value," Matt said. "It's just another way for us to encourage people to stop by, spend time with friends and family, and enjoy some great food and drinks in downtown Paso Robles."



A hidden gem of the Central Coast

Spend a day at the Estrella Warbirds Museum and Woodland Auto Display. See rare military aircraft and vehicles, as well as an amazing collection of restored automobiles ranging from American and European classics to racetrack winners. The Woodland Auto Display has been called the best auto museum on the Central Coast.

The museum was established 30 years ago at the Paso Robles Municipal Airport and is dedicated to restoring and preserving military aircraft, vehicles, and memorabilia. From its first hangar, the museum has grown to a 20-acre, 14-building

complex of exhibit halls, workshops, a library, a gift shop, and conference facilities.

Estrella Warbirds Museum

Experience history firsthand by standing next to an amazing array of military aircraft and armored

The displays feature fighter airplanes from the Cold War to the present and include a Link Trainer Flight Simulator to a state-of-theart, full-size F/A-18 cockpit simulator used for pilot training. Make an appointment for a Friday or Sunday, and reserve your own flight time in the simulator! The displays in Freedom Hall include artifacts from WWI to the present, featuring actual cockpit instrument displays from US and Japanese fighters, as well as a Norden bombsight used by US bombers in WWII.

The museum hosts the Gooney Bird Group (GBG) and its C-47, Betsy's Biscuit Bomber. Betsy has chronicled quite a history, logging over 9400 flight hours in service with the air forces of the US, Belgium, France, and Israel. The group acquired Betsy from Canada where she had been mothballed for six years and returned her to full flight status in 2009. In 2019 Betsy flew to the UK to participate in the 75th D-Day anniversary reenactment along with many of her sister C-47s and DC-3s. For a visual treat, search online for "Daks over Duxford," and watch your choice of YouTube videos of this anniversary celebration.

The Red Ball Express display features restored large military logistics vehicles used to support General Patton's late 1944 march to the Battle of the Bulge.

Woodland Auto Display the jewel in the crown

The jewel in the crown at the museum is the Woodland Auto Display. Be prepared to be amazed at the 20,000 square-foot display hall featuring a range of vehicles from the 1886 Benz Motorwagen to a 2005 Ford GT 550, and everything in between. Autos on display include American, European, and Japanese classics, all in showroom condition. Steve McQueen's Indian motorcycle and sidecar are on display as well as an accurate recreation of an Indy 500 workshop with actual garage doors from the famed




Brickyard. The auto display's collection of race cars cannot be matched and includes midget, sprint, Silver Crown, modified NASCAR, and Indy racers. The auto memorabilia that line the display hall walls is well worth the visit.


An open invitation





Visit an old-time saloon rooted in Paso Robles history

Pine Street Saloon is a Paso Robles legend

Before "Beer for My Horses" hit the country music charts the Pine Street Saloon was already serving horses and their riders. The Pioneer Day parade, held annually in October, unofficially ends at the Pine Street Saloon where, for the past 40-some years, horses are ridden right up to the bar. Saloon owner Ron French said, "People get a real kick out of it and how often do you get to have a beer with a horse?"

Sharing a beer with a horse isn't the only thing that sets this bar apart. You might find yourself bending an elbow with a ghost. Regulars talk about noises and things moving. "I don't believe in ghosts," said French. "It's an old creaky, wooden building." Nevertheless, French set up night-vision cameras and has video footage of glowing "supercharged dust particles" zipping through glass and around the room and lamps and a vacuum cleaner moving across the floor.

A few years ago, the rumors of hauntings earned the Pine Street Saloon an episode on the Travel Channel's hit show, The Dead Files. This year the Travel Channel returned to film a new episode for Ghost Adventures, scheduled for release around the end of 2021.

The saloon has been in the family since purchased by


French's mother, Pat, in 1971. Built around 1857 the saloon had a reputation as a bordello and visits from Jesse James. Drury James, one of Paso Robles' founders, was Frank and Jesse's uncle. In May 2021, the Pine Street Saloon was voted the "Best North County Bar" in the New Times "Best of SLO County."

No-nonsense drinks, live music, entertainment and safe rides home

"We have daily drink specials and serve lots of beer, Jack and Coke," said French. "We can make foo-foo drinks but they're not very popular here."

The saloon is cash-only but there's an ATM. The décor is rustic. There are pool tables and

the jukebox plays two kinds of music: country and western. A food trailer serves on Thursday, Friday and Saturday nights.

Karaoke, Open Mic and live music guarantee a good time. "About 10 local bands play here on a rotating schedule.

Once in a while we mix in out-oftown acts and sometimes we are just surprised!" said French. "Pink has dropped in to sing Karaoke. Merle Haggard was a regular, even recorded a commercial for us a few months before he died. I haven't aired it out



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Savor the flavor: Taste local premium olive oils

Olive oil tasting involves smelling the aroma of an oil, and then sipping it to taste its positive attributes. Official tasters drink the oil from dark blue glasses, to ensure they can't see the color of the olive oil (and be influenced by an oil's green or gold color).

Look for three qualities

Tasters should look for these three positive attributes:

Fruitiness: Any positive organic smell or taste.

Bitterness: A sign of freshness that is usually tasted on the sides of the tongue.

Pungency: A peppery, burning sensation in the throat.

Not all olive oils have all three of the attributes, but some should be present. Try it for yourself!! Grab that bottle you've had in the pantry for ages, and taste it to see if it's still good. Pour some into a wine glass—about an inch or two high—cover the glass with one hand while warming the base of the glass with the other. Place your nose into the glass after a minute and breathe in. Does it smell fruity, like green apples, cut grass, or tomato leaf? Great! Or does it smell unpleasant, like paint thinner, bacon, or a musty cellar? In that case, it's probably defective and should be thrown out.



Next, slurp in about a quarter of a teaspoon and let it sit on your tongue while you breathe in. Finally, swallow a bit and look for any signs of pepper in the throat. If an oil has a greasy feeling on your tongue, it's probably past its prime.

Remember, olive oil is a fresh product, much like a fruit juice. It needs to be used within 24 months of when it's made, and it needs to be used within a few months of opening the bottle.

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
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Everyone is welcome at Jada Vineyard & Winery

Taste a full portfolio of wines in a relaxing, nature-centric environment

When the Riboli Family of Riboli Family Wines added Jada Vineyard and Winery to their portfolio of sustainable, small-lot vineyards and wineries in 2021, Jada General Manager Joshua Messina called the union, "A nice marriage of families and cultures." Today, as they introduce new vintages and varietals crafted by Head Winemaker Nate Hall, the team at Jada is enthusiastic to welcome visitors and locals to experience their tasting room and 95-acre estate for themselves.

Sustainable and certified organic

Although the winery has been farming organically since 2014, it was with the support and investment of the Riboli Family that the vineyards at Jada were officially certified in 2022 by the California Certified Organic Farmers (CCOF). In addition, the winery and tasting room were certified sustainable by the California Sustainable Winegrowing Alliance (CSWA).

"Our team is very proud of the work we have done in the vineyards," Messina said. "A lot of our visitors express interest in where and how things are grown. So, it's nice when people enjoy a glass of wine surrounded by our organically farmed vineyards, where no pesticides or herbicides are used."

Vineyard-focused winemaking

Hall, who has been part of the team since 2017, was promoted to head winemaker earlier this year. He is the kind of winemaker that "really makes wine in the vineyard," Fourth generation winemaker Anthony Riboli says, adding Hall is always out

in the vineyard strategizing how to make the wines.

"If our wines speak of where they are grown, it's because Nate is a vineyard-focused winemaker," Riboli said. "A sensitive winemaker considers the weather, soils, and everything at the beginning of the growing season. He is studying all aspects now so he knows what kind of wine to make later."

Building on his portfolio of fine wines, Hall added three noteworthy white wines to Jada. The 2023 VIII VIII Chardonnay boasts notes of lemon thyme, citrus, Asian pear, and stone fruit and an abundance of chamomile, jasmine blossoms and white melon.

The 2022 XCV Viognier, described as having refreshing notes of orange blossom, peach, and beeswax with lively bursts of acidity, opening to waves of nectarine, lemon oil, stone, honey, thyme, and lemon zest, is the perfect wine to serve at holiday gatherings. Their newest addition, the 2023 Lotus Eaters Sauvignon Blanc, boasting notes of melon, passion fruit, guava, and pineapple, pairs well with fresh salads, fish, turkey, and barbequed chicken.

"All of these new wines are modern in flavor profile," Hall said. They are putting a lot of time and effort into vineyard blocks where the cabernet is grown, and we are eager to see just how good those grapes can be."

When a decision had to be made, Edgar decided to follow his passion for making wine instead of pursu-




Clearly, he made the right choice – after 22 years in the wine industry, Edgar is a well-respected winemaker and part of the thriving wine community. The Bodega de Edgar brand has expanded to include a dozen wines, each receiving top accolades with 92 to 96-point ratings. 




Due to the Templeton Gap's uniqueness, ONX grows over twenty grape varietals, including Rhone, Bordeaux, and Iberian grapes. Additionally, due to the terroir, microclimates, geography, and geology, ONX also grows several whites, including viognier and picpoul blanc. There are approximately 127 planted acres, producing 18 varietals; with the addition of the Willow Creek Vinevard, there are an additional three varietals. A certified sustainable winery, ONX is working on converting all of its vineyard operations to fully organic.

As you sip the wines, your host explains the grape and its characteristics and flavor profiles, including growing and harvesting practices. The second generation leads the way

Located just off Highway 46 West Lin the heart of Paso Robles wine country, Bethel Rd. Distillery and Winery is located across the street from Castoro Cellars. The family venture is the perfect spot to enjoy craft spirits and wine in a cozy and inviting setting.

Max continues to be involved in the production side, while Luke manages the marketing and social media (as he does for Castoro Cellars). "We're an artisan distillery and winery focused on making the finest spirits and wines. 





Bruce Hansen: His wine and the wine roadshow

The wine roadshow helped put Paso Robles wine on the map

There was a time back in the 1990s when few people outside of the area knew about Paso Robles wine. "So a bunch of us decided to take our wines on the road and introduce them to the rest of the country," said Bruce Hansen, founder and winemaker of Hansen Vineyards. "We picked an area, found someplace where we could pour wine like a hotel or some event, loaded the wine in the trunk of the car, and off we'd go."

The group made three or four trips a year between 2003 and 2009 to locations in California, Las Vegas, Phoenix, Dallas, and the East Coast. "Sometimes we flew, but most of the time we drove," Bruce said.

Rich Hartnberger, founder and winemaker of Midnight Cellars, Doug Kruse of Jack Creek Cellars, Danny Panico of Dover Canyon Winery, and Joe Barton of Grey Wolf Barton Family Wines, came immediately to Bruce's mind when talking about the wine roadshow.

Rich Hartenberger reports,
"These trips were critical to spread
the word. Paso was virtually unknown back then, and people were
very open to learning about this new,
exciting wine region!" He adds, "Of
course, Justin Baldwin, Tobin James,
Gary Eberle, and Art Norman,
among many others, led the way for
all of us newcomers."

Building wineries and creating wine

Traveling for wine was nothing new to Bruce. Before starting Hansen Vineyards, he made a living building winery and vineyard buildings. "I must have built around 500 different buildings for wineries from California up into Oregon," he said. "Yes. I built everything here, too, from our home to the Cab House, and the rest."

Bruce Hansen's personal history with winemaking goes back to his childhood in Michigan. "Dad made wine at home and I helped him, which didn't make Mom happy," he reports. As an adult, he picked up winemaking tips and lessons from the various winemakers he worked with when constructing their winery buildings.

The friendships he made during his construction years helped launch Hansen Vineyards & Winery. When the time came for him to make wine he bought a former almond orchard in 1992. After ripping out the old trees, he started planting rootstock, which has become 30 acres of 10 to 20-year-old vines growing mostly cabernet sauvignon grapes. Hansen Vineyards 2001 Cabernet Sauvignon was his first release.

"I had some great mentors," said Bruce as he listed off names including Gary Eberle, Danny Panico, winemaker at Dover Canyon, Craig Reed, now at Castoro Cellars, Alan Kinne, winemaker at Martin & Weyrich, and Christian Roguenant, now at Lightpost Winery in Morgan Hill.

Since its first release, Hansen Vineyard & Winery has become known for excellent, award-winning wines. Bruce oversees everything with precise detail, from planting, growing and harvesting, to barrels, fermentation and bottling.

The vines grow in soil consisting mainly of nutrient-rich black adobe with an abundance of shale and limestone. The wines are aged in 100% French Oak barrels for two and a half to four and a half years, accounting for the amazing results and the reason the wine is so drinkable shortly after being bottled. He produces around 1500 cases a year.


Most recently, Hansen wines were awarded gold and silver medals at the 2024 American Fine Wine Competition. The Hansen Cab House 2019 Cabernet Franc and the Hansen Cab House 2021 Cabernet Franc both won gold medals. The Hansen Cab House 2017 Cabernet Sauvignon and Hansen Cab House 2018 Cabernet Sauvignon both won silver medals.






